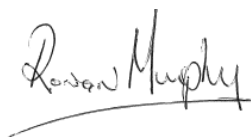

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III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Every Athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

-coming to Hungary to be accompanied by an FEI passport. In case of arrival from an EU-member-country or other country belonging to the TracesNT System, a veterinary health certificate (Traces NT) will be necessary.

Any Horse receiving a new Primary Course as of 1 January 2024 must be vaccinated as follows:

-V1 (initial vaccination);

-V2 (second vaccination) must be administered 21-60 days after V1; and

-V3 (first booster) must be administered within 6 months and 21 days of V2.

-Horses must be subjected to a valid equine influenza vaccination not more than 6 months old.

A minimum of seven days must elapse between the last vaccination and arrival at the event.

-HORSES MUST BE SUBJECTED TO A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST NOT MORE

THAN 12 MONTH OLD.

-Horses must be subjected to a negative Glanders (Malleus) test not more than 3 years. (if the athlete comes from a third country or from Hungary)

-if the athlete comes from a third country or from a non EU member country, it is necessary for all horses coming to Hungary to be accompanied by an FEI passport and a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of TRACES valid issue

-Horses from Romania may come from horse farms listed on the list in Articles 2 and 3 of Commission Decision 2010/346 / EU. The athlete must produce the original certificate, not a copy. Horses must be subjected two Coggins tests: one within 30 days and another 10 days before arrival.

Concerning EHV it is necessary to take the horse's temperature according to the FEI Rules, and Record on the FEI Horse App the equine influenza vaccination details following administration of a vaccine.(Use the Horse App). Every rider has to bring their own clinical thermometer.

On arrival on the place, a horse examination will be carried out by a FEI veterinarian before entering in the stables, with a possibility of refusal of suspected horses and their transport partners.

The horse can only be removed from the carrier after its temperature has been taken.

During the event, FEI veterinarians may conduct random fever tests on the horses in the presence of the owner/athlete.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy. We ask all riders to arrive with the 30 days valid TRACES if possible. (equine intra-and hit head station)

-Horses must be subjected to a valid equine influenza vaccination not more than 6 months old.

A minimum of seven days must elapse between the last vaccination and arrival at the event.

-HORSES MUST BE SUBJECTED TO A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST NOT MORE THAN 12 MONTH OLD.

-Horses must be subjected to a negative Glanders (Malleus) test not more than 3 years. (if the athlete comes from a third country or from Hungary)

-if the athlete comes from a third country or from a non EU member country, it is necessary for all horses coming to Hungary to be accompanied by an FEI

passport and a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of TRACES valid issue

-Horses from Romania may come from horse farms listed on the list in Articles 2 and 3 of Commission Decision 2010/346 / EU. The athlete must produce the original certificate, not a copy. Horses must be subjected two Coggins tests: one within 30 days and another 10 days before arrival.

Concerning EHV it is necessary to take the horse's temperature according to the FEI Rules, and Record on the FEI Horse App the equine influenza vaccination details following administration of a vaccine.(Use the Horse App). Every rider has to bring their own clinical thermometer.

On arrival on the place, a horse examination will be carried out by a veterinarian before entering in the stables, with a possibility of refusal of suspected horses and their transport partners.

The horse can only be removed from the carrier after its temperature has been taken.

During the event, FEI veterinarians may conduct random fever tests on the horses in the presence of the owner.include additional details if necessary

3.NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Square for Organiser to include additional

Any Horse receiving a new Primary Course as of 1 January 2024 must be vaccinated as follows:

-V1 (initial vaccination);

-V2 (second vaccination) must be administered 21-60 days after V1; and

-V3 (first booster) must be administered within 6 months and 21 days of V2.

-Horses must be subjected to a valid equine influenza vaccination not more that 6 months old.

A minimum of seven days must elapse between the last vaccination and arrival at the event.

-HORSES MUST BE SUBJECTED TO A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST NOT MORE THAN 12 MONTH OLD.

-Horses must be subjected to a negative Glanders (Malleus) test not more than 3 years. (if the athlete comes from a third country or from Hungary)

4.PONIES

Ponies must be in compliance with the Veterinary Regulations to be eligible to compete in pony events.

5.INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post-mortem examination.

6.TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for infectious disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes,

or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations.

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (FEI General Regulations).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA.

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL.

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by an FEI veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and microchip (where present), their vaccination status and meet the FEI's health requirements to access the FEI Stables Area. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, infectious disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS.

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION.

Horses may be subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8.EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP).

8.1 SAMPLING.

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING.

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

1.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

1.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

1.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

1.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties

caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

1.2.2 Additional Liability Information

1.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

2. PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by the relevant deposit (CHF 150.- or equivalent for Protests and CHF 500 or equivalent for Appeals), as mentioned in the FEI General Regulations:

3. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

4. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the Approval of the Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and Officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

5. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

Art 109.13 GRs: All dogs must be leashed and affixed to a human or stationary object. Violation of this rule will incur a fine of CHF 100 per offence and, in case of a repeated offence at the Event, may lead to exclusion from the Venue

Vehicles: Parking is only permitted at the designated location. Horse transporters and riders can park near the stables.
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The scheduled starting times of the tests may change depending on the number of entries.
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DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS:

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations)

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money announced for the competition. Distribution of prize money: distributed to 25 % of participants. If there are between 5 and 19 athletes in the competition, min 5 prizes must be distributed.

If there are 4 or less athletes in the competition, the table below applies.
